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But after three years of betrayals, why would anybody trust the Tories to deliver Brexit?

We remember how Theresa “come what” May promised that we would leave the EU on March 29th. She promised it not once, or twice, but 108 times. Yet March 29th came and went, without the UK going anywhere.

Labour has turned its back on 5m Leave voters

Mr Johnson is advertised as a Brexiteer, who resigned as foreign secretary rather than support Mrs May's Withdrawal Agreement. He even said her deal would reduce Britain to a “vassal state”, a slave of the EU. We remember, however, that Boris still swallowed his words and voted for it in Parliament at the third time of asking.

Never mind turkeys voting for Christmas, that looked more like Spartacus voting for slavery.

With an untrustworthy Tory Party and a Parliament packed with Remainers, the best a Boris government seems likely to come up with is a re-hashed version of Mrs May's treaty. And make no mistake about it, that was not a deal but a new EU treaty - written by Msr Barnier - the sort of document a nation would only sign if it lost a war.

When we listen to the Tories' promises, let's ask ourselves: would you buy a second-hand withdrawal agreement from this party?

If the Conservatives *can't* deliver Brexit, we now know that the Labour Party plain *won't*. Jeremy Corbyn's Labour has finally come out as a party of the second referendum, with a commitment to campaign for Remain.

Corbyn the alleged “man of principle” has turned his back on his own history of left-wing Euro-scepticism, learned at the knee of Labour giant Tony Benn. He has bowed to pressure from the political pygmies of Labour's Remainer front bench – proving that, like other Labour leaders before him, Corbyn is less attached to his principles than his personal status.

More importantly, Labour has now officially turned its back on millions of traditional working-class voters. Five million Labour supporters who voted Leave have been turfed out of their political home.

Corbyn's Labour has made clear that it is now much more interested in courting the metropolitan middle classes. It is the party of North London rather than the North of England, the Midlands or Wales; representing Islington and Hackney rather than Islwyn or Hartlepool.

We are getting ready for a General Election, selecting candidates to fight every seat. The battle lines are already being drawn. The out-right Remainer parties – the Liberal Democrats, Greens, Change UK and the rest - are colluding to stand together on a Brexit-detesting ticket.

Only The Brexit Party can be trusted to stand and fight the Remainer establishment for the clean-break Brexit backed by 17.4m voters. Only The Brexit Party can take on Corbyn's Remainer Labour Party in the Brexit heartlands of Britain's regions.

Since we launched in April, The Brexit Party has given hope to millions of politically homeless people. That's why we made history by winning the European elections in May, only six weeks after launching. And it's why the establishment parties are scared stiff of what we could do in a General Election.

We are out to put principles such as trust and integrity back at the heart of our politics. For a start, that means standing up as the only party that can be trusted to deliver a proper Brexit.

‘BORIS WILL SELL OUT BREXIT FIRST CHANCE HE GETS’

ON LONDON:

“It sickens me to be honest. It reminds me of Dubai, a little city state by itself. It pushes its values onto the rest of us. And we don’t like them.”

ON BORIS:

“I’ve been to parties with Conservative MPs who say ‘yes, we voted for Boris, he’ll let us down, ha, ha, ha’. He’ll be a catastrophe.”

ON CORBYN’S LABOUR:

“A disaster, led by an imbecile. He loathes Great Britain and indulges anti-Semitism. I mean, what more do you want from somebody?”

ON THE BBC:

“I’ve got 200 BBC friends. None, nil, zero voted Leave. A few security guards may have.”

OUTSIDE A LONDON PUB, OUR PHOTOGRAPHER ASKED ROD LIDDLE IF IT WAS ALL RIGHT TO SNAP HIM WITH WINE AND CIGARETTE IN VIEW.

Of course, said Rod, ‘otherwise people won’t believe it’s me’. It would be hard to mistake Mr Liddle. A top columnist for the Sunday Times, the Sun and the Spectator, irascible Rod entertains the nation with views which tend to divide opinion - between ardent fans and those who want him banned. It’s called free speech in a democracy.

Liddle is at his incisive and divisive best in his new book, *The Great Betrayal: the true story of Brexit*; a coruscating indictment of the villains he blames for the UK’s failure to leave the EU,

delivered in a style befitting this Millwall fan from Middlesbrough. Rod’s rogues’ gallery stars Theresa May’s government, Remainer MPs, Project Fear peddlers, the BBC (where he used to work), London, and all the ‘hyper-liberal’ cultural elite.

The chapter about them “I Don’t Know Anyone Who Voted Leave” is the most important, Liddle thinks. ‘They were so shocked by the referendum result, it was “who are these ghastly people who voted Leave?” They had to compress it into one idea: “They’re all old, pig-ignorant, racists, Northerners”. None of which was true. I mean there were some pig-ignorant Northerners, and some clever Northerners. But it wasn’t a homogenous vote.

‘Who are these strange people all voting Leave? It’s the country you ****s. Outside your bubble.’

Whether to vote Leave or Remain in 2016 was, Rod admits, ‘a close call for me’. What ‘really infuriated’ him was the anti-democratic Remainer backlash. That reaction, however, has ‘done us all a favour. It’s shown that this liberal elite is totalitarian, insulated, impervious to reason.’

Rod left the Labour Party over the anti-Semitism scandal. ‘Labour did betray Brexit but it’s not a principal villain’. And now that Jeremy Corbyn (‘Magic Grandpa’) has finally come out for a second referendum? ‘I think Labour might sweep up Remain votes and lose Leave votes in the North and Midlands – but not necessarily to

the Tories.’

Liddle thinks we will find out soon enough, foreseeing an autumn general election. He is unimpressed with fellow journalist Boris Johnson. ‘Boris will sell out Brexit as soon as he gets a chance.’

As befits the author of *The Great Betrayal*, Rod is not upbeat about the prospects for a proper Brexit. ‘I don’t think we’re getting it’. He was ‘incredibly conflicted’ over whether Mrs. May’s withdrawal agreement would be better than not leaving at all. ‘But it would still be a betrayal if we left under that deal.’ And is Boris likely to come up with something similar? ‘Yes, probably even softer.’

Despite joining the new SDP, Rod voted for The Brexit Party in May’s Euro-

pean elections, ‘with gladness of heart’. ‘I hate to give panegyrics but we are extraordinarily lucky to have a politician with Nigel Farage’s defiance and implacability. Without that none of this would have happened.’

However it ends, the battle for Brexit has changed everything. ‘The vote to Leave was historic, and so is the betrayal. And it’s bred a fury among some Leavers, like me. But I suspect among the majority, a sullen resentment that the bastards will always win. Why would you vote again? It’s what I hear in Middlesbrough, from steelworkers galvanized into voting Leave after their industry was closed under EU rules. And now they say you can’t beat them.

‘But you can beat them. I think the tide will turn.’

Brexit, Rod argues in his book, is just the start of a cultural war for Britain’s soul. ‘It’s not just about the EU, it’s about who governs us and whether we’re allowed our view. And we’re not allowed our view.

‘We’ve been betrayed. But I do think there’s some good to come of it. Because now we know. You know? And it’s a fundamental shift. Left and Right matters not at all. We just want those middle-class liberals out of the ****ing way.’

CHAIRMAN'S LETTER

Brexit is a huge opportunity to make Britain stronger. Stronger growth in the economy, stronger regions, stronger democracy, stronger in defence, stronger on the international stage. Stronger in many other areas, too. This requires confidence, leadership, and great people. I am convinced we have better people and better policies coming forward than any other party. This is how we Change Politics for Good.

At our Big Vision rally at NEC Birmingham in June, we announced our plan for rebuilding Britain's regions: a massive £200 billion investment in local road, rail and digital infrastructure outside London. This would be the biggest investment plan since the war.

It can be paid for by not doing three simple things. Firstly, scrapping HS2, which we said would cost £100 billion; the truth has now come out, with the boss of HS2 admitting that our figures are correct. Secondly, we must not send Brussels the £39 billion it's demanding. Thirdly, we must redirect half the bloated Foreign Aid budget back to the UK, saving some £60 billion over seven years. The Tories' suggestion that we should send £100 billion overseas to pay the EU and aid budget is ludicrous, when we have so much to do at home.

Fairness is key. It is not fair that London receives up to four times the infrastructure investment of the rest of the UK. The Mayor of London has just announced that the whole tube network will have free broadband in a few years; fine, but The Brexit Party think this should apply to all public transport across the whole UK.

Young people should have a much fairer deal on the cost of studying. The Brexit Party will scrap all interest, past and future, on all student loans.

We do of course have a new Prime Minister. He leads a party that cannot be trusted to deliver Brexit, having failed for three years. A party riddled with MPs who think it's a clever tactic to take no-deal off the negotiating table. A party that recommended the worst deal in history which would leave us trapped in the EU's strait-jacket.

We have always felt that we must be ready for an autumn general election. We are identifying target seats held by both major parties across the country. As we near the end of the huge task of selecting more than 600 top candidates to be MPs, from more than 3000 great applicants, I know we are on the right track. I am in awe of the courage of those putting their heads above the parapet for the first time in public life. Later we will be seeking thousands of candidates to stand in local council elections next May.

We will be very busy in August with distributing The Brexiteer, mailings, leafleting, street stalls and much else. We need your help to keep spreading the word. There is much to do to keep moving forward towards the Brexit we all want.

‘BIGOTS? WE’RE THE EU’S MOST DIVERSE PARTY’

WALKING THROUGH THE CORRIDORS OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT IN STRASBOURG BROUGHT BACK A NEAR-FORGOTTEN FEELING FROM MY DISTANT PAST. I LOOKED AROUND AND IT SUDDENLY HIT ME!

As a child in the 1980s, I realised that I was the only black kid in the playground. In 2019 it was happening again, only this time the children are much bigger, and I am an MEP in a Parliament representing over 500 million citizens across Europe.

It's estimated that ethnic minorities make up around 10% of the total EU population, outnumbering the population of Spain

(represented by 54 MEPs). Yet the Brussels-based European Network Against Racism (ENAR) found that, of the 571 MEPs, only 19 males and 17 females from racial and ethnic minorities were elected in May 2019.

The United Kingdom elected the highest number of ethnic MEPs – seven – more than half of those from a single party. Not the Liberal Democrats, nor the SNP, but my own. The Brexit Party, without quotas or preferential treatment, has more ethnic MEPs than any other. This is ironic given the constant claims that The Brexit Party, and Brexiteers in general, are racist, divisive and discriminatory.

The EU executive collects data on the representation of LGBT people and women, but not on race or ethnicity. Why would that be? What terrifies the EU about confronting the issue of race? Moreover, why are apparently progressive Remainers silent on the issue when it comes to their beloved EU?

Only 13 out of 28 member states elected any non-white candidates. ENAR attributes this lack of representation to various factors, including structural racism, exclusion from society and direct discrimination in voting. A recent Harvard University study

of European attitudes towards people of different races found that the UK is one of Europe's least discriminatory nations. Ironically, the most Europhile countries appear to be some of the most negative towards ethnic minorities.

My personal experience from my first week in Strasbourg was not positive. I found myself placed in a lower ground floor office, some distance from my colleagues, next to a self-proclaimed Neo-Nazi group. I initially put this down to incompetence, but was advised by longer serving MEPs not to underestimate the lengths to which EU officials will go

to make things uncomfortable for Eurosceptics.

Scaremongers claim that the UK will become an inward-looking racist society upon our exit from the EU, but this could not be further from the truth. It makes me proud to be a Brexit Party MEP to know we are not just the biggest but the most representative party in the European Parliament. It also makes me proud to be a UK citizen knowing that, when Brexit happens, it will be the EU that will be less diverse, and not the UK.

WHY I LEFT LABOUR FOR THE BREXIT PARTY

I was a Labour Party member for 27 years after joining as a teenager. I worked at the party HQ and advised Tony Blair's ministers. As a Labour councillor in my hometown, I led children's services. I never expected to be driven out of my political movement.

Jeremy Corbyn is Labour's most unsuitable potential prime minister. Corbyn brings a toxic culture. Nasty identity politics and mob rule by a metropolitan clique have hijacked every level of the party. Labour today is angry with the world and with itself. It is unfit to govern.

After campaigning for Remain – and losing – in 2016, Labour promised in the 2017 general election to respect the referendum result. With the

ballot papers of millions of Labour voters in the Midlands, Wales and the North barely counted, the party was already on the path to a betrayal of trust. Now Corbyn has committed Labour to a second referendum, in which it will campaign for Remain.

Labour has capitulated to the pro-EU prejudices of the metropolitan middle classes. The party's soul, forged in Britain's industrial heartlands and market towns, is being sold to corporate interests in Brussels. Trade union leaders – who take money from the European Commission – sneer at working-class communities for daring to vote against their corporatist EU project.

The Brexit Party calls out all the mainstream political parties for trying to use Parliamentary chicanery to overturn the biggest democratic mandate in our history. Never before has a political party come from nowhere to win a national election, as The Brexit Party did in May's European polls. And we're only just getting started.

We need a clean break from Brussels. We will not truly take back control of our laws until we have Brexit Party MPs at Westminster. What is so exciting is that we are a coalition of patriots drawn from all walks of life, who believe that Brexit can be a great success. Democracy only works when people take charge of the decisions that shape their lives. I believe many more made politically homeless by Labour will support The Brexit Party.



WIDDERS: ‘FREE SPEECH IS FOR ALL’

Brexit Party MEP Ann Widdecombe returned to the Oxford Union in July to make the case for free speech and against 'No Platform'. This followed her June speaking tour, when various venues pulled out in the face of criticism. (Ann then went on to sell out bigger venues anyway.)

Our intolerant critics want to ban or 'No Platform' The Brexit Party and exclude us from the media – a bid to silence 17.4m Leave voters. Widdecombe warned the Oxford Union that 'snowflake' supporters of such censorship are playing with fire. 'You may feel virtuous today in what you will not hear,' she told students, 'but tomorrow someone may feel virtuous in not hearing what YOU have to say'.

Freedom of speech must always mean what George Orwell called 'the right to tell people what they do not want to hear,' about Brexit or anything else. As Ann Widdecombe reminded the Oxford students, 'Free speech is for all, not for the privileged few!'

FORGET ABOUT TWEAKING MAY'S DEAL

JUST BEFORE HE RESIGNED AS TORY CHANCELLOR, PHILIP HAMMOND REFERRED TO BREXITEERS AS 'NOISY, VULGAR AND UNTHINKING'.

That's typical of the way the Oxbridge Remainers who dominate our politics and the media exhibit contempt for Brexit voters – and for democracy.

Arch Europhile Matthew Parris, writing recently in The Times, compared the effects of a 'no-deal' Brexit to the alleged deliberate asphyxiation of passengers onboard Malaysian Airways flight 370.

Retired Supreme Court judge Jonathan Sumption calls Brexiteers 'grim fanatics' and describes Brexit as 'economic vandalism'.

These ideologues believe their views are based on rational aversion to 'no-deal' – but they really reflect a quasi-religious devotion to the undemocratic EU.

Pro-EU scare stories abound. Join the Euro or become an economic backwater, they told us 20 years ago; vote Leave and induce immediate recession, they said in 2016 – mistaken predictions, both.

Now even the supposedly independent Office for Nation-

al Statistics has joined the chorus, forecasting catastrophe in the event of a no-deal Brexit. No surprise, really. Its boss is Jonathan Athow, who previously worked at the Treasury. His last boss: top Tory Remainer George Osborne.

The real danger to Brexit now is that MPs delude themselves that a tweak to the 'Irish backstop' is all that's needed to fix Theresa May's wretched mega-deal.

In fact, the payment of £39 billion for which there is no legal obligation, as the House of Lords ruled in 2017, is a bigger issue. As indeed is the deal's indefinite 'transitional' period, during which the UK remains stuck in the customs union.

Failure to regain control of our fishing, and the promise of years of further wrangling over a potential free trade deal, are further nails in the coffin.

So, Boris, please forget about tweaking Theresa May's deal – it's a trap to keep the UK tied to the EU. In fact, if we stay in the customs union for even one day after October 31st, the government won't have delivered Brexit.

Instead, let's offer to be friends with the EU, go for a clean-break Brexit on WTO terms, and head for the sunlit uplands of democracy. We can sideline unelected presidents, invest £39 billion in the UK, end tariffs on non-EU imports and regain control of fishing.

We'll be far better off on day one, and the world, as fishermen say, will be our lobster.
